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Why do we interview?

Our interviews are designed not only for us to assess your suitability for the course, but to make sure you are choosing the right course for you. Universities interview in particular for courses where a specific skill set is required, or where the course leads to a profession.

What will happen on the day?

Some of these skills might be:

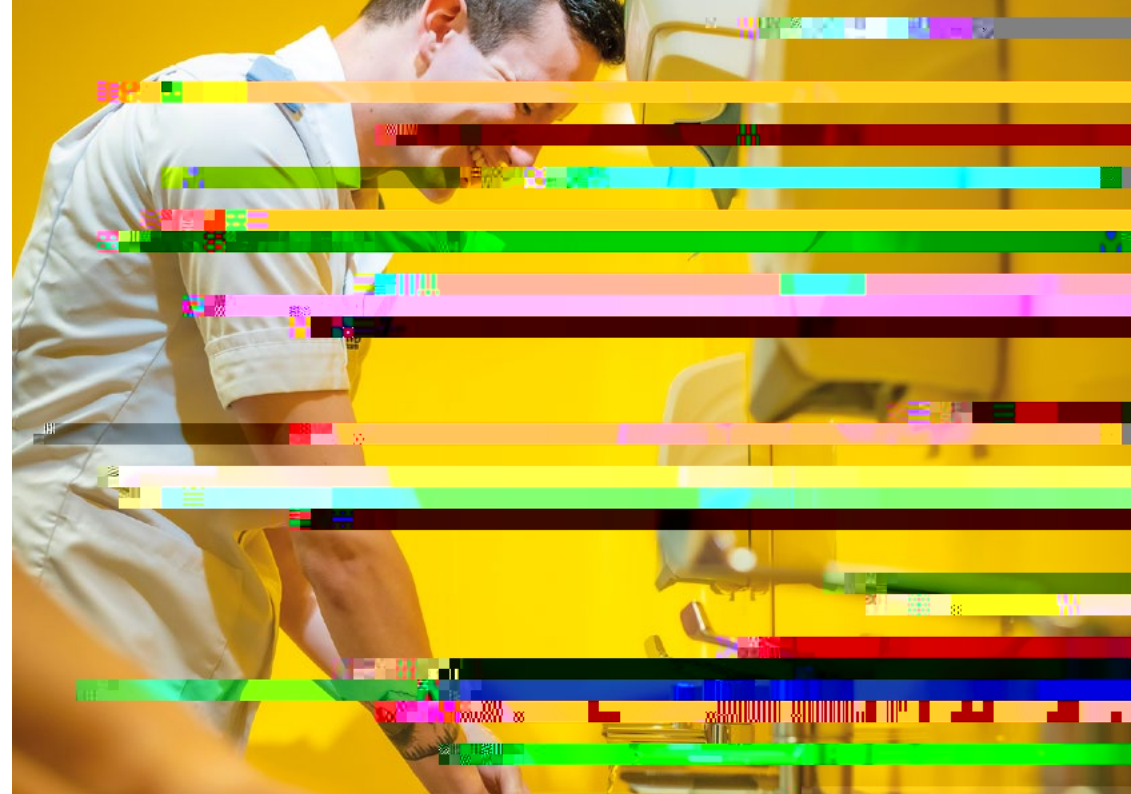
- The ability to use information to construct your own opinion
- Willingness and the ability to analyse
- Problem solving skills
- Good communication and interpersonal skills.

Aside from course specific preparation you can also:

- Organise a practice interview for yourself; ideally the person interviewing you will be a teacher/careers adviser, but preferably not someone who knows you very well. This will help you to get experience of talking about yourself and your work in an unfamiliar environment
- Review your personal statement. Think about how you might expand on what you have written if asked to discuss in more detail.
- Think about skills and knowledge that you have gained through work or your current study that is relevant to nursing. i.e. working in a team or dealing with challenging situations and how you can apply these transferable skills to a health and social care context. You will be expected to give examples.

What happens if I am running late on the day?

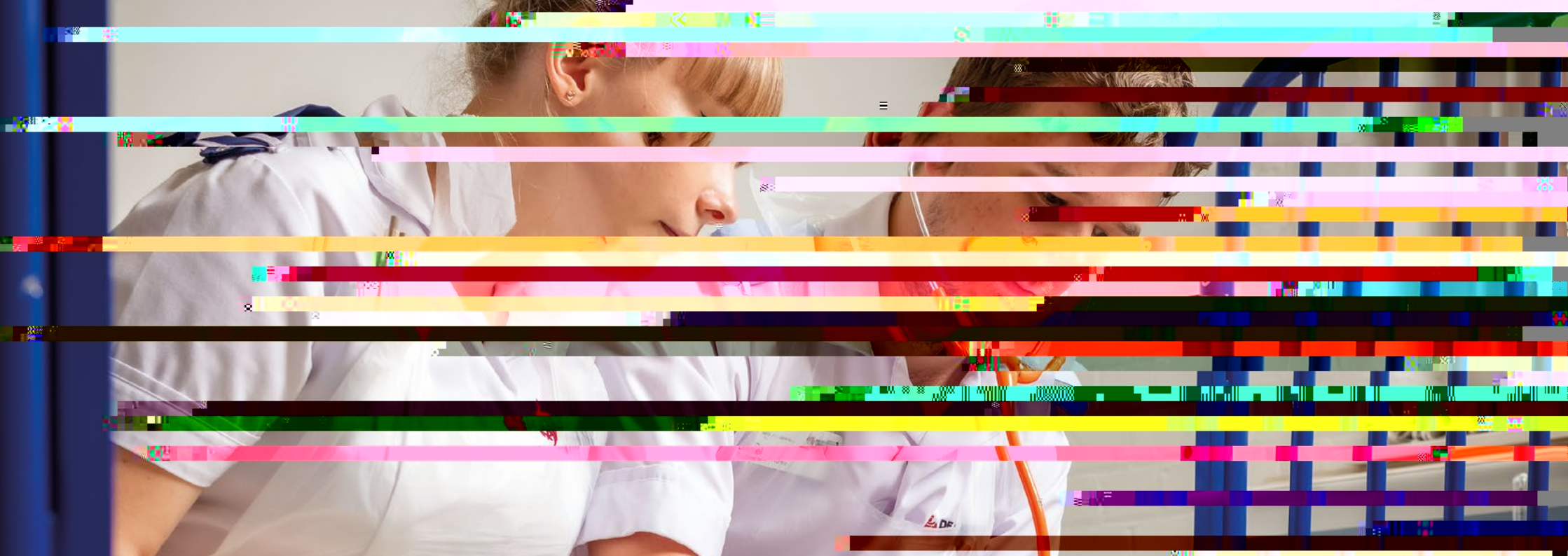
