Seeing you perform and work collaborative others in a workshop enables us to understand more accurately the skill level that you are cur and whether Acting at DMU would be an appropriate choice for you. What are we looking for?

We are not looking for perfect, highly experienced, professional actors (you are coming here to rather we are looking for evidence of competent qualities in a number of areas such as;

Levels of focus and concentration in performance

Ability to communicate vocally and physically

Ability to understand and embody a theatre text

Willingness to be open to receiving direction

Ability to con dently express a grasp of language, pace and rhythm.

Ability to be open to tasks and to other people

To be active in your participation with others

How you communicate and interact with others

How you respond creatively and imaginatively to instruction

Ability to listen to and build on other people s ideas.

What can you do to prepare?

Choose appropriate material remember you are choosing a character as much as a text, don to hard by trying to play a character many years older than yourself for example. Avoid texts with intense or heightened emotions such as anger or crying.

Prepare make sure you learn your texts in plenty of time and have given your work a physical your work with others so that you are used to presenting a monologue in front of people. Con shape of your performance so that the performance doesn t feel, look or sound the same throughways good advice to read the wholeqtigyst the scene so that you have a better understanding the context of the character at this moment. The more prepared you are, the calmer you will be the audition.

Perform your work in your own voice, don't put on an accent or a character voice.

On the day - Zarm up vocally and physically before your audition. Try to relax and be yourself, to see your unique, wonderful qualities.

A note on the monologues:

You will be asked to prepare two contrasting monologues, one from the 21st Century and on pre-21st century. Please do not be worried about performing your piece exactly as you had pared it we will ask you to re-try parts of your work again with supportive suggestions fro tutors so you can relax a little and develop your material. This also gives us a chance to see you respond creatively to instruction.
